We have received PPP loans to keep us going despite not being able to hold our annual fundraiser. 2021 is already looking brighter as we work to fill our funding gaps. We have had setbacks and are building back with the help of so many whom we would like to thank for their generosity:

The Taylor Family Foundation – donated \$5,000 despite not being able to hold camps this past year, they wanted to make sure that our horses were supported so that the riders would be able to enjoy them at the next available camp.
